



Phoenix Class - September 2025

Dear Parents and Carers.

Welcome back to school. I hope that everyone has had the opportunity to spend time as a family and make some memories. I'm very excited to start a new year and get stuck into the learning we have planned. Please find an outline of what we are learning below.

In our writing lessons this term we are going to be writing to entertain by focussing on our descriptive writing and narrative writing skills before creating explanation texts. Our writing will be inspired by the dark mystery 'The Malamander' by Thomas Taylor.

Our first Geography topic of the year is 'Cartography and Land Use' we will learn how to use maps and atlases to explore the world around us. We will discover the difference between physical features and human features. We will practise using atlases, grid references, symbols, and compass points to describe locations and plan journeys. Finally, we will investigate how land use in our local area of Sutterton has changed over time, comparing old maps and photographs with those we use today.

In Science lessons this term, we are studying 'Evolution and Inheritance'. We will learn how living things change over time and how they pass on traits to their offspring. We will find out how fossils give us evidence about animals and plants that lived millions of years ago, and how scientists like Mary Anning and Charles Darwin made important discoveries. We will explore how animals and plants adapt to their environments, why some traits help them survive better than others, and how these changes can lead to evolution. We will also learn about inheritance, variation, and hybrids.

Mrs Baker will be teaching RE on Friday afternoons this term. Their first topic will be looking at creation stories and how people with different religious worldviews express their beliefs through music.

Our Art lessons are going to explore Street Art and Graffiti this term. We will be looking at kinds of stylised text, Banksy and how street art has been used as satire.

In PSHE children will be looking at how they can keep healthy as they grow. We will be discussing, healthy eating, oral hygiene and the importance of sleep.

PE will be taking place outdoors on Mondays and Fridays this term. If this changes at any point, I will contact you. Please ensure that your child ahs their PE kits labelled.















Homework


