



Dear Parents and Carers,

The children are all back with their lovely smiles and positive attitudes after a lovely but short half-term break away. This year has gone so quickly, and this term will only get busier. This newsletter is filled with information about what your child will be getting up to and has some important dates to note down!

In English the children will be focusing on writing to entertain. We'll explore texts such as 'The Lighthouse

Keeper's Lunch' and 'Commotion in the Ocean' creating narratives and poetry.

This term, our exciting new topic is 'Under the Sea' where will be exploring seaside locations from around the world. Our journey will begin with focusing on the continents and oceans. Children will then dive into beach habitats, examining both human and physical features as well as the diverse marine life. An important part of our learning will be investigating plastic pollution and its impact on marine habitats, encouraging children to think about how we can help protect our oceans.



In Science, we are continuing to learn all about animals. The children will explore how animals survive in their natural environments and learn to identify and name animals based on their habitats. Using key scientific vocabulary, the children will describe different animals and begin to understand how they can be classified including mammals, fish, reptiles, birds and amphibians, omnivores, herbivores and carnivores. As part of the topic, they will get a chance to create their own habitats, thinking carefully about what animals need to live and thrive.

In RE we will continue to explore places of worship including the mosque, church and synagogue including why these are special places to worship and pray. Children will be able to name and label the key features of a church and what some parts signify. They will also get to visit our local church.

In PSHE children will be looking at 'Economic Wellbeing'. They will get more of an understanding of money, what it is, how we get it, how to choose what to do with it and keep it safe.

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
Personal Belongings

Reading Books

Phonics Book

Your child will read their phonics book three times a week within school. Your child will then bring their new phonics book home on a Thursday. This book is based on your child's phonics level which has been decided from their assessment. Please ensure your child's previous phonics book is in school on the Thursday morning so we can issue their new one.

Accelerated reader books (Year 2 children)

Your child should read this book at home either independently or with someone. Once they have read their book a few times, they will do a reading comprehension quiz. The outcome of the quiz will then determine their next book.

Regents reading incentive.

It's wonderful to see both children and parents getting more involved with reading at home! This term, we are going to place even more emphasis on the importance of reading. Through reading, children not only enhance their vocabulary, spelling, grammar, comprehension, and fluency, but also develop important skills like creativity, problem-solving, independence, and emotional intelligence. Most importantly, reading fosters a love for books, which can greatly benefit their mental well-being. Children who are reading **3 times a week or more** (on separate days which must be recorded in their reading records) will receive a prize out of the dippy box on a Friday.

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Homework

Each week your child will be set homework. Every child has a blue homework folder, and this is where their homework will be. Please ensure all homework is back in school the following **Friday morning**. All homework which has been handed in on time will get 2 dojo points. Your child can also access the online app Sumdog-this is a great app for maths. Log ins for your child's Sumdog account can be found in the inside page of their reading record.
