Lego Therapy

Lego based therapy is a social development program that uses LEGO activities to support the development of a wide range of social skills within a group setting. Playing with LEGO promotes social interaction, turn-taking skills, sharing, collaborative problem-solving and the learning of concepts. It can be used to target goals around social skills, language, and motor skills.

Federation staff will receive training on using Lego Therapy in Growing Acorns, our lunchtime nurture and pastoral club or during targeted interventions.

Staffing News

Following an extensive recruitment process by The Emmaus Federation, we are delighted to announce **Mrs Teri Brown** as Head of School for Sutterton Fourfields from January 2023.

Mrs Brown grew up in Boston. She read English and Science as part of her teacher training degree later becoming a Senior Leader in Education for English and Assessment for Learning. This role allowed her to work closely with the Connect Teaching School Alliance in order to share her expertise when delivering training to trainee teachers and NQTs.
