## Dear Parents/Carers,

It seems like only yesterday when we were sending out the autumn class newsletters about the exciting teaching and learning taking place across the federation. It has been a term of adventure and challenge, where our pupils have had the opportunity to be involved with and shape many nurturing and enriching experiences, such as the Harvest or outstanding Remembrance Service. Our staff are highly committed to providing the very best for the pupils and encourage the children to aim for excellence and to fulfil their individual potential academically, socially and personally. We want the children to thrive in our Christian church schools and to become successful, confident and caring children who will be able to play an active role in society.

We are keen to adapt wider changes which will benefit our federation and raise standards. Consultation sessions have been held with parents, staff and governors regarding our desire to join the Lincoln Anglican Academy Trust (LAAT). The reason for choosing this action is that we would like to make an informed choice and select the best academy we feel will offer the best support for our schools. We are keen to work with an academy which allows us to retain our identity and add further strength as a federation of church schools - to work with an academy which puts the children and the community first, rather than a large chain of schools where identity and ethos may be lost. The support that LAAT is able to offer in terms of Payroll, Legal, Financial, HR, and School Improvement will also improve the current reduced levels of service provided to maintained Local Authority schools and allow a better use of the school budget and time spent by senior leaders on matters other than education.

Of a more practical nature, the weather has now turned and frosty mornings with mist over the dykes and fens greets many of us on our way to school. Please make sure your child is dressed appropriately for the cold weather as we will not be able to let the children out to play without a coat in cold weather conditions. Communication in the event of school closure due to snow is now easier due to all the new parent communication tools that we have launched this year. As soon as a decision is made to close the school, a message will be tweeted on the school Twitter site (@EmmausFed). It does not matter if you are not signed up to Twitter or the federation site as our Twitter messages are posted on our school website. Once the teaching staff have received a message regarding a closure, they will also post a message on their class DOJO site. We will, of course, inform Lincs FM and Lincolnshire County Council if you would prefer to use the more traditional communication routes.

### Ofsted


