**Dear Parents and Carers** 

Welcome back to a new school year - I hope you all had a peaceful and restful holiday! We were pleased to see that the children have returned to school safe and well and have obviously enjoyed their long break! A special warm welcome to all our new parents and children. We hope you enjoy a long and happy association with The Emmaus Federation and that your children will succeed to the very best of their ability during their time at our school.

Our curriculum has been significantly revised over the summer term and all classes have been provided with a deep and comprehensive plan for the whole of the curriculum for each particular year group with the outcome being that the content is one that is much deeper, thorough and with enrichment opportunities.

The federation has invested heavily in many new school improvement initiatives and we look forward to your child sharing their new learning with you. The Collins Busy Ant Maths scheme will be taught to pupils alongside White Rose Maths and TT Rock Stars. Accelerated Reader (AR) will also be undertaken by all KS2 pupils. The children will read in class for 30 minutes per day and will also need to read for 30 minutes at home. The children then undertake a quiz on what they have read with a focus on reading comprehension. The Education Endowment Foundation has carried out a great deal of research on AR and it is regarded as being one of the best reading programmes available with an average improvement on outcomes of 3 months and 5 months for children in receipt of free school meals.

We have also looked closely at the school timetable. We have reduced the number of whole-school assemblies to ensure more time is directed to learning. All children will still take part in daily worship and we will still continue with 'Open the Book', (a bible drama group), Father Charlie's collective worship, class assemblies and celebration assembly. Assemblies at Sutterton will start at the slightly earlier time of 8:50 am.

The behaviour management strategies for the federation have also changed. We are keen to optimise the ever popular Class Dojo even further and pupils will be able to gain additional points for the new initiatives which we have brought in. This year, pupils can also lose Dojo

points. The Dojo points gained will then be accrued to spend at the Dojo Shop. We will remove Golden Time as this is deemed to be no longer effective as a strategy. We will instead award Dojo points and use the time more productively in ensuring the curriculum is covered in depth and is more enriching.

#### **Drop-Offs**

Children should enter the school through the main side gates. We have had a couple of instances of parents taking their KS1 child through the KS1 gate and then walking around the school with their KS2 child. KS2 children should enter through their own KS2 side gate and parents to leave their child at the gate. This encourages independence for KS2 children and reduces any potential safeguarding issues.
