They represent Boston and District as winners of the small and large schools leagues. A derby 'friendly' will be hosted in the early spring against these two colossal teams. A massive thanks goes to the players and our rugby coaches.

## Parents, Teachers and Friends Association (PTFA)

Our schools identity as being an open door and friendly place is helped by the tremendous work of the PTFA. They work tirelessly to raise funds for the children and to provide fun events throughout the school year. They have kindly offered to subsidise 50% of the cost of each pantomime ticket and Sutterton PTFA are giving the school £500 to spend on new reading books. They wouldn't be able to do their work without your support – thank you.

## Lincoln Anglican Academy Trust (LAAT)

Our application to join LAAT was put on hold back in the summer term 2017. Our Governing Body have declared an interest in re-joining and we are currently in the process of seeing if an application can be successful. We will then start the conversion process and we will inform you of what this entails.

In the interim, The Emmaus Federation will utilise the school improvement systems of LAAT and work collaboratively with other local church schools. Our identity will not change, but we will have stronger support systems within an education system that has changed significantly since austerity measures and the change in focus to more of an academy model from the Department for Education.

### Fundraising

The generosity of our families is truly amazing and I realise we do sometimes fundraise quite a lot, but as compassionate educators, it is difficult to not want to help and support so many worthy causes. We will limit the amount of fundraising events, but I do still want to celebrate things like Children in Need, PTFA events and other main charity events. These may be a coffee afternoon, a non-uniform day or simply a day of awareness.

However, let us celebrate what we have achieved so far. Sutterton raised £327.78 at the Macmillan Coffee Morning, which included £45.00 raised by the Village Hall Bingo Club and Sutterton's School Council raised £11.00 for Young Minds

Swineshead raised £188.85 at the Macmillan Coffee Afternoon and Swineshead School Council raised £22.25 for Young Minds. Tremendous!

### Packed Lunch Policy

Our Mid-Day staff have got together to review our Packed Lunch Policy. It was felt by some families that it wasn't really working and the 'Treat Friday' idea had lost its impetus, if not even followed! The new Packed Lunch Policy is more 'fit for purpose' and allows your child to have a treat like a small bag of crisps, if desired. However, we do want to be sensible and if a child's lunch is often unhealthy (following Schools Food Trust guidelines) then we will let you know and offer your child a meal so they have got something substantial and nutritious to eat.

### Fantastic Progress

We have invested a significant amount in curriculum school improvement (Busy Ant Maths and Accelerated Reader) and it's great that with support from home, we can tangibly see the great progress that our pupils are making.

Swineshead Year 6 using Accelerated Reader have made 9 months progress since the start of term and Year 6 pupils at Sutterton have made 5 months progress.

### Remembrance Assembly

We hear from families, months after our Remembrance Assembly about how much they enjoyed it and how meaningful it was.

We are keen to hear from service personnel, past and present, to help us reflect on the sacrifice of those who fought in the Great Wars and those who have been affected by conflict. Our Remembrance Assembly will be held on 9<sup>th</sup> November and all families and members of the community are welcome.
